ACTIVITIES

- To produce a National evidence based report to establish the current position within the sector throughout the UK and make recommendations on how best to support the sector going forward.
- Co-ordinate written and oral parliamentary questions and debates on issues that affect entrepreneurs, tabling Early Day Motions (EDM) when appropriate.
- Organise events with Parliamentarians and key members of the entrepreneurial community, especially with but not limited to disabled entrepreneurs.
- Organise events with school and university students and emerging entrepreneurs.
- Arrange meetings between group members, Government Ministers and officials; establishing and maintaining contact with other relevant Parliamentary groups in Westminster and other relevant organisations internationally.
- Initiate and participate in Parliamentary debates encouraging increased funding and initiatives for the development of inclusive entrepreneurship in the UK.
- Create an Inclusive Entrepreneurship Accelerator Programme particularly for disabled people which includes a mentoring program.
- Upscale Inclusive Entrepreneur Network
- Organise a recognition programme culminating in an Annual Event at the House of Commons, presenting Awards to Entrepreneurs with protected characteristics, alongside companies who support inclusion in business.
- Link with the Stock Exchange regarding companies run by entrepreneurs with protected characteristics.

OUTPUTS

- A direct and influential route to Government Ministers, Shadow Ministers, politicians and officials.
- A forum for inclusive entrepreneurs to be heard in Parliament and Government.
- Well-informed advocates on inclusive entrepreneurship and related issues within Parliament.
- The maintenance of cross-party and cross-chamber consensus on inclusive entrepreneurship.
- The ability to assist the political agenda of the inclusive entrepreneurial sector in Westminster.
- The exchange of views and information between members and international colleagues through inter-parliamentary debates and events.
- Formal recognition of the sector, role models, individuals and its importance within the economy and society as a whole.
- Position the UK as a global leader in the field of academia in respect of inclusive entrepreneurship / economic growth.
